



The City of Craftsmanship

Craftsmanship in Sanjo dates back to the early Edo period (1603-1868) when, in order to provide relief to local farmers suffering from the frequent flooding of the nearby Ikarashi River, nail blacksmiths were invited from Edo (present-day Tokyo) to encourage those farmers to make Japanese nails on the side. Metalworking caught on, and since the Meiji period (1868-1912), the trade of a wide range of metalworks including cooking knives, blades, and hand tools forged using the blacksmithing techniques passed down through the generations has flourished. Those high-quality metal products—both artisanal and industrial—are being manufactured throughout Sanjo for domestic and international sale

The Outdoor City



The Sanjo Ikagassen (kite battle) dates back to 1649, when a jinya (samurai residence) was established in Sanjo. Jinya residents flew square kites on Boys' Day to celebrate the feudal lord's status as a benevolent ruler.

Since then, Sanjo's residents—particularly the jinya residents and local blacksmiths—have participated in this kite battle every year. The shape of the kites changed over time, leading to the present-day tradition unique to Sanjo of using hexagonal kites in the annual kite battle. A visual spectacle, this competition is taken seriously, with participants ranked and a champion announced at the end.

Curry ramen became popular in the early Showa era (1926-1944) as a delivery dish for blacksmiths. Curry ramen differs depending on the restaurant, but generally there are two types—either the ramen broth is curry-flavored or the ramen has curry on top.






